Jimmie has been a tremendous asset working with the staffing agencies in Cullman, helping the residents obtain employment with the many employers here in Cullman. Through his hard work, Jimmie has cultivated excellent relationships with the staffing agencies and this has opened doors for the residents to obtain good steady paying jobs that begin the process of laying the solid foundation for our residents move on to a successful life beyond the Bryan Clay House. Thank you, Jimmie, for your dedication, determination, and diligence in helping make the Bryan Clay a helping hand to those that God places in our care. Meet WILLIE MONTGOMERY



After 46 years of incarceration, how does it feel to finally be free?

"I give all thanks to God that I am free at last. I knew from day one that God had a plan for me and would make a way for me. I can't describe the great feelings and the opportunity to meet new people in my church family.

What has been your biggest joy?

"What I have lived for and prayed for all these years, was for God to keep me healthy and alive; to finally be able to meet my youngest daughter and spending time with all of my girls, grandchildren, and great grandchildren; and getting home to eat at all of these new fast food restaurants and eat good home-cooked meals with my family and friends."

What has been your biggest surprise?

"My biggest surprise has been how much things have changed and how many new places there are to eat."

How has the Bryan Clay House helped you since your release?

"God has delivered on His promise to take care of me while I was incarcerated. Now God has put Mr. Albert Pugh and Mr. John Means in my life to help me as I begin this next chapter of my life. It has been so great living here, getting to know the other residents and participating in the various classes and church services held here at the Bryan Clay House. I have also enjoyed meeting the other volunteers and church groups that are involved in the Bryan Clay House. They have truly been a God sent present to me and I am so blessed to be here."

What are some of the key things that you have learned?

"I came close to dying in 2018, so I made a promise to God that if He pulled me through and let me rejoin my family, that I would do my best to walk and serve Him. The biggest thing that I have learned is forgiveness, patience with others and most of all trying to learn to be a real Christian in my walk with God. I have learned that there are some real Christian brothers in Mr. Pugh, Mr. Means and the other guys that love and care for God's people no matter what."

And what would you want others to know about the Bryan Clay House?

"The first thing to know and understand is that the Bryan Clay House is run by some great Christian men with big hearts, who don't mind giving you a chance to restore your life. I also know that and whatever your past was, it is in the past. I am from Montgomery, Alabama. I have 4 daughters, 12 grandchildren, and 5 great-grandchildren waiting for me, but I am not ready to move back any time soon.



THE INSPIRATION TO BE AN INVESTOR

During the almost three years I have been on staff, time after time, I have been inspired by the men whom God has placed in our care at the Bryan Clay House. It has been a worthwhile investment of our heart, our time, and our love. I am always in awe of how God uses this ministry to transform lives and give men a place where they can come into their own. We have a great opportunity to provide the men a place where they can become the men God called and created them to be before the foundation of the world. What an awesome God we serve, who never throws in the towel and never gives up on us! He sees what we cannot see and He knows the end from the beginning. He does not look at our past mistakes as the end of the world, but as an opportunity for Him to get the glory, by turning an impossible situation to work for our good and for His good.

I have experienced this in my own life, where time after time God turned what seemed like an impossible situation to work for my good and for His good. I give God all the glory for bringing me through those many impossible situations. And I have been inspired as I watch the men grow, to witness those revelation moments, where they discover for themselves that God has a plan and a God-given purpose for their lives; to learn for themselves that God is not finished with them yet; and because God so loves them, that they have a future filled with hope and possibilities. How amazing is that!

So, with all that said, I want to briefly share some thoughts that came from some of the lessons we are studying from our Roundtable groups on Thursday nights, where we look at a different value principle each week. The two value principles that have drawn my attention are *Inspiration* and *Investing*.

In every Roundtable session, each person in the group takes a turn reading a paragraph. I would like to quote from the lesson on *Inspiration* found in the first and second paragraphs, which I believe capture the heart of our mission at the Bryan Clay House. The first paragraph quote reads:

"Inspiration brings hope to people's lives and instills the belief that dreams can become a reality...We give that person hope for a beneficial future. We provide that person the tools needed to grow and a good environment for personal development."

I believe that it does not get any plainer than that. The Bryan Clay House is providing a good living environment, where men are inspired to dream and believe God to live out their God given purpose; and that there is indeed a better future for them. The Bryan Clay House is a place of refuge, where men can develop and grow; and day by day, take the necessary steps towards a better and brighter future filled with hope. And from the second paragraph:

"All of this starts with caring about people and wanting the best for them. People do not care how much you know until they know how much you care".

What a difference the demonstration of the love of God makes. At the Bryan Clay House, we believe that this is the most important thing that we do. The demonstration of the love of God is always a life changer. It certainly changed my life and I have seen this same change in the lives of the men who come to the Bryan Clay House.


In the lesson on *Investing*, I would like to share from the second paragraph which reads:

"There is a proverb that says, "It is possible to give and become richer. It is possible to hold on too tightly and lose everything," Giving of ourselves, our ideas and our resources will lead us to experience greater and better things personally and collectively. However, if we refuse to share these things, we will miss out on what could have been and limit our potential. If we do not invest in others, we will stunt our own personal growth."

How true that has been for me. I have personally been blessed beyond measure by the many people who have poured into my life. I would not be the man I am today, if not for the people who believed and invested in me. This is why I believe in investing in the men at the Bryan Clay House. I have

experienced much personal growth and I am forever richer and grateful for *"Investing"* in the men at the Bryan Clay House.

So, I will leave you with these final thoughts to ponder and asked yourself: *"What opportunities is God calling me to, so that I can be an inspiration to others? And how can I be an investor into others around me?*
